Sam Poh Kong Temple & Hang Li Poh's Well

As a premier historical and cultural heritage site in Malacca, it reflects the close cultural exchanges and diplomatic ties between 15th-century China and the Malacca Sultanate. It is deeply intertwined with Admiral Zheng He's maritime expeditions and the legendary story.



Heeren Street

As one of Malacca's most iconic historical landmarks, the Red Square is famous for its vibrant, crimson Dutch-colonial buildings, including the renowned Stadthuys and Clock Tower. It is a must-visit hotspot for travelers looking to capture picture-perfect moments and immerse.



Jonker Street

Also known as Jonker Street, this is Malacca's most famous cultural and culinary hub. Bustling with antique shops, unique handicrafts, traditional Peranakan (Nyonya) culture, and an array of authentic local delicacies, it is one of the absolute best places to.



The Red Square

Located in Malacca City, the capital of the Malaysian state of Malacca, The Stadthuys is a historic structure widely recognized as the oldest surviving Dutch building in Southeast Asia. Commonly referred to as The Red Square (or Dutch Square), it.



A' Famosa Fort

As one of Malacca's most famous historical landmarks, A' Famosa (Porta de Santiago) was built by the Portuguese in 1511 following their conquest of Malacca, originally serving as part of a massive fortress. Today, only this gatehouse remains, standing as.



St. Paul's Church

is one of the oldest church ruins in Malaysia, originally built by the Portuguese in 1521. It was later repurposed by the Dutch as a burial ground and place of worship, and today, its ancient stone walls and historic tombstones.
