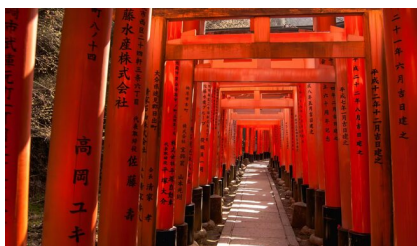
**Day 1** Kuala Lumpur (KLIA) Osaka (Kansai Airport) MH 52 (2210/0540+1)

## **Kyoto. Fushimi Inari Grand Shrine**

Founded in the 8th century for rice and sake deities, Kyoto's Fushimi Inari Grand Shrine now promotes business prosperity. As one of Japan's most popular sites, it serves as the head for 40,000 Inari shrines nationwide.



## **Takayama Sakurayamahachiman shrine&Takayama Yatai Kaikan**

The Takayama Yatai Kaikan houses eleven fall festival floats, rotating four on display thrice annually in March, July, and November. Visitors can experience a revival of the festival atmosphere through guided tours led by a shrine maiden.

## **Takayama Jinya**

Takayama Jinya is Japan's only surviving Edo-period governor's office. Once a strategic hub under direct Shogunate control for its rich timber and mineral resources, the complex includes historic residential quarters and storehouses used for collecting tax rice.



## **Takayama Old Street: San-machi**

San-machi is Takayama's iconic sightseeing district and former merchant center. Selected as a traditional building preservation area, these beautiful 300-year-old streets near Takayama-Jinya keep the history of the old castle town alive today.



## **Shirakawa Gassho Village (Sakura Viewing: Mid of April)**

This UNESCO World Heritage site features 250-year-old gassho-zukuri farmhouses designed for heavy snow. Their unique nail-less roofs provided attic space for silkworm cultivation, representing a traditional architectural style perfected over many generations.



### Higashi Chaya

Kanazawa features three well-preserved Edo-era chaya districts: Higashi Chayagai, Nishi Chayagai, and Kazuemachi. These exclusive venues offer geisha entertainment through traditional song and dance, maintaining the atmosphere of historic entertainment districts once located outside city limits.



### Kanazawa Kenrokuen (Sakura Viewing: Mid of April)

Considered one of Japan's three most beautiful landscape gardens, Kenrokuen was crafted by the Maeda family over two centuries. Opened in 1871, it showcases a masterpiece of ponds, waterfalls, teahouses, and seasonal flora.

### Kanazawa. Omicho Market

Explore Kanazawa's historic Omicho Market, famously known as "Kanazawa's Kitchen." This vibrant market features numerous stalls offering fresh local seafood, seasonal produce, and street food, providing an authentic glimpse into the region's rich culinary culture on Day 4.



### Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route

Traverse the spectacular Northern Alps via cable cars, ropeways, and buses. Famous for its massive spring snow walls, this unique mountain route is open from April to November, offering a world-class journey through breathtaking scenery.

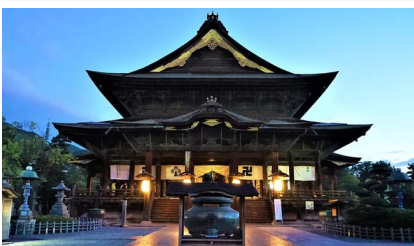

### Matsushiro Castle (Sakura Viewing: Mid of April)

Matsushiro Castle, a registered National Historic Site in Nagano, served as the Sanada clan's stronghold during the late Edo period. This historic site offers visitors a profound look into Japan's feudal history and traditional samurai architecture.



### Zenko-ji Temple (Sakura Viewing: Mid of April)

Zenko-ji is one of Nagano's most important temples. Its vibrant approach is lined with numerous shops selling local souvenirs and small restaurants, offering visitors a perfect blend of historic spirituality, unique shopping, and traditional Japanese dining.



**Kusatsu Onsen (Japan Top 3 Hot Spring) visit Yubatake Onsen Old Street**  
 Located in the heart of Kusatsu, the iconic "Yubatake" produces a staggering 230,000 barrels of natural hot spring water daily. This geothermal landmark is the town's symbol and highlights its status as a top-ranked Japanese hot spring destination.

**Ikaho Mizusawa-dera**  
 Legend claims Ikaho Mizusawa-dera was founded in the Asuka period to introduce Buddhism to the region. However, no physical structures or records exist from before the Edo period to verify these ancient origins.



**Ikaho Onsen Street & Ikaho Shrine**  
 Ikaho Onsen Street features a historic 360-step stone staircase spanning 300 meters. With 400 years of heritage, the scenic steps are lined with traditional hot spring resorts and souvenir shops, offering a beautiful and classic Japanese experience.



**Misato Shibazakura Park (end of April ~ Beginning of May)**  
 Open for just one month from mid-April, Misato Shibazakura Park attracts visitors with tens of thousands of brightly hued moss phlox, creating a stunning seasonal carpet of vibrant pink and purple blooms across the landscape.

**Ashikaga Flower Park (Mid of April ~ Mid of May)**  
 Ashikaga Flower Park is a 9-hectare destination in Tochigi, renowned for its spectacular wisteria and seasonal blooms. Located two hours from Tokyo, it is the city's most famous attraction, offering visitors a breathtaking experience of vibrant floral beauty.



**Hitachi Seaside Park (Mid of April ~ Beginning of May)**  
 Every spring, 4.5 million blue nemophilas transform Miharashi Hills into a stunning light-blue landscape. This breathtaking floral display is perfectly framed by the blue sky and the vast Pacific Ocean backdrop.
