Basilica Sagrada Familia (Entrance Included)

A large Roman Catholic church designed by Catalan architect Antoni Gaudí (1852-1926). Part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site; in November 2010 Pope Benedict XVI consecrated and proclaimed it a minor basilica.



Park Güell (Entrance Included)

A public park system of gardens and architectonic elements on Carmelo Hill, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984.



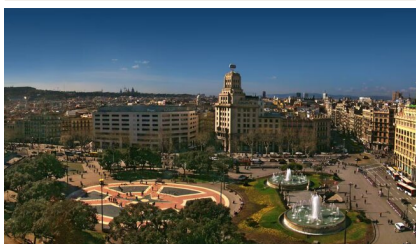
Barcelona Club Football Stadium (Photo Stop)

The legendary home of FC Barcelona and one of the most iconic football stadiums in the world.



Montjuïc Park

A hilltop park overlooking Barcelona's harbour, home to lush gardens, museums and panoramic city views.



De Catalunya

A large square in central Barcelona regarded as both the city centre and the meeting point of the old city and the 19th-century Eixample district.



Las Ramblas

Barcelona's most famous tree-lined boulevard, packed with street performers, cafés, flower stalls and boutiques.



La Roca Village Designer Outlet

A premium open-air outlet just outside Barcelona, featuring over 140 luxury and fashion boutiques with year-round discounts.



Serranos Towers

One of the twelve original gates of Valencia's ancient city wall, built in the late 14th century in Gothic style.



The Bullring (Plaza de Toros)

A 19th-century neoclassical bullring inspired by the Roman Colosseum.



Estació del Nord

The main railway station of Valencia, located in the city centre next to the bullring.



Town Hall of Valencia

An elegant historic building on Plaza del Ayuntamiento, home to the city government and a landmark clock tower.



Cathedral of Valencia

A Roman Catholic parish church consecrated in 1238 by the first bishop of Valencia after the Reconquista.



Octagonal Bell Tower (El Miguelete)

The iconic octagonal Gothic bell tower of Valencia Cathedral, completed in 1429.



Art and Science Complex

A futuristic architectural masterpiece by Santiago Calatrava, housing a planetarium, science museum, opera house and Europe's largest aquarium.

Day 5 *Alicante -> Granada*



Santa Bárbara Castle

A medieval fortress perched on Mount Benacantil, offering sweeping views over Alicante's coastline.



Generalife Gardens

Meaning "garden of the architect," located on Cerro del Sol beside the Alhambra. A series of large gardens where every corner holds a novelty and pleasant surprise for the eyes.



Flamenco Show Dinner

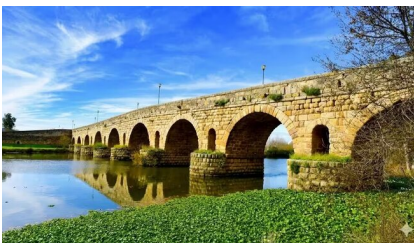
An authentic evening of Spain's iconic art form -- passionate flamenco music and dance -- paired with a traditional dinner.

Day 6 *Granada -> Cordoba -> Seville*



Mosque of Cordoba (Mezquita)

An extraordinary structure blending Islamic and Christian architecture, originally built in the 8th century as one of the largest mosques in the world.



Roman Bridge

The view over the Mosque-Cathedral with the river and bridge is one of Cordoba's most wonderful sights, especially at dusk when the stone glows a deep golden red.



Seville Cathedral

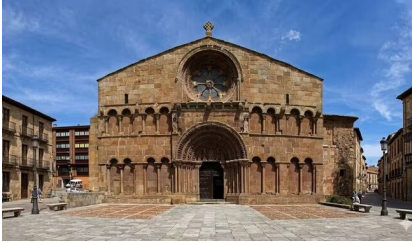
A Roman Catholic cathedral in Seville, the largest Gothic cathedral and third-largest church in the world. Registered by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site in 1987.



Torre del Oro

A dodecagonal military watchtower built by the Almohad dynasty to control access to Seville via the Guadalquivir River.

Day 7 *Seville -> Toledo*



Church of Santo Tomé

Dating from the 12th century and completely rebuilt in the early 14th century by the Count of Orgaz. Its tower is one of the best examples of Mudéjar art characteristic of Toledo.



Cathedral of Toledo

A magnificent 13th-century High Gothic cathedral, considered one of the greatest examples of Gothic architecture in Spain.



Toledo (Panoramic View)

The former imperial capital of Spain, a UNESCO World Heritage city set above the Tagus River and known as the "City of Three Cultures" for its Christian, Muslim and Jewish heritage.



Alcantara Bridge

A Roman stone arch bridge built over the Tagus River between 104 and 106 AD by order of Roman Emperor Trajan.

Day 8 *Toledo -> Madrid*



Royal Palace of Madrid

The official residence of the Spanish Royal Family, today used only for state ceremonies.



Puerta del Sol

One of Madrid's busiest and most famous squares, considered the symbolic centre of Spain and home to the "Kilometre Zero" marker from which all Spanish roads are measured.



Plaza de España & Cervantes Monument

A large square and popular tourist destination featuring a monument to Miguel de Cervantes, bordered by two of Madrid's most prominent skyscrapers.



Plaza de Cibeles & Cibeles Fountain

An iconic Madrid landmark featuring the marble fountain of the goddess Cybele, surrounded by grand buildings including the Cibeles Palace.



Real Madrid Stadium (Santiago Bernabéu)

The legendary home of Real Madrid Football Club and one of the most prestigious football venues in the world.



Las Ventas Bullring

Madrid's grand Neo-Mudéjar bullring opened in 1931, considered the most important bullfighting venue in the world.



El Corte Inglés Department Stores

The biggest department store group in Europe and ranked third worldwide, carrying the most comprehensive collection of designer brands of any large store in Spain.

Day 9 *Madrid -> Segovia -> Salamanca*



Segovia Cathedral

Known as "The Lady of Cathedrals," this 16th-century late-Gothic cathedral is the last great Gothic cathedral built in Spain.



Aqueduct of Segovia

A remarkably preserved Roman aqueduct built around the 1st century AD, standing 28 metres tall and stretching over 800 metres -- a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



Old City of Salamanca

An ancient university town north-west of Madrid, home to one of the oldest universities in Europe, which reached its peak during Salamanca's golden age. Its historic centre features important Romanesque, Gothic, Moorish, Renaissance and Baroque monuments.



Casa de las Conchas

A 15th-century palace famously decorated with more than 300 carved stone shells on its façade, now home to a public library.



Salamanca Cathedral

Two cathedrals joined together -- the Romanesque Old Cathedral (12th century) and the Gothic-Baroque New Cathedral (16th century).



Old Roman Bridge

A 2,000-year-old Roman bridge spanning the Tormes River, originally part of the Roman Silver Route.



Plaza Mayor & Town Hall

One of the most beautiful main squares in Spain, an 18th-century Baroque masterpiece surrounded by elegant arcades.

Day 10 *Salamanca -> Fatima -> Lisbon*



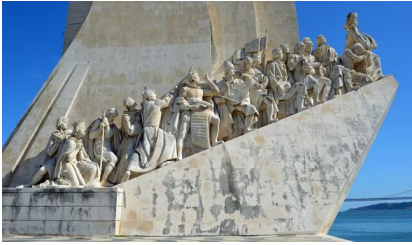
Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Fatima

A major Catholic pilgrimage site built on the spot where the Virgin Mary is said to have appeared to three shepherd children in 1917, drawing millions of pilgrims each year.



Basilica of the Most Holy Trinity

A modern circular basilica completed in 2007, one of the largest Catholic churches in the world, located within the Sanctuary of Fatima.



Monument of Discoveries

Built in honour of Henry the Navigator, who was instrumental in the success of Portuguese explorations during the 15th century.



Avenida da Liberdade & Pombal Statue

Lisbon's grand tree-lined boulevard often compared to the Champs-Élysées, lined with luxury boutiques and ending at the towering statue of the Marquis of Pombal, who rebuilt Lisbon after the 1755 earthquake.



Cristo-Rei Statue

A Catholic monument and shrine dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ, overlooking Lisbon from across the Tagus River.



Belém Tower

A 16th-century fortified tower built in the Manueline style on the bank of the Tagus River. A UNESCO World Heritage Site and an enduring symbol of Portugal's Age of Discovery.



25th April Bridge

The oldest bridge across the Tagus River in Lisbon, a 2km+ suspension bridge opened in 1966 after almost four years of construction.



Jeronimos Monastery

A monastery built in the early 16th century in a Portuguese variant of the Gothic style. Considered one of Lisbon's most magnificent buildings and classified a UNESCO World Heritage Site, along with the nearby Belém Tower, in 1983.
