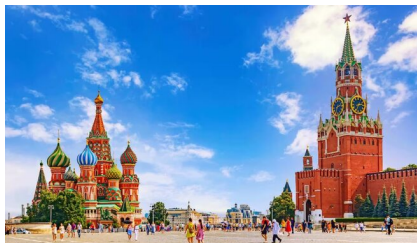

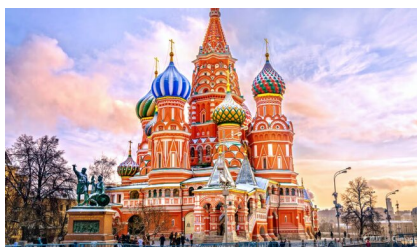
Day 1 Kuala Lumpur -> Moscow Reference Flight: HY554 (1100/1600), HY601 (1900/2120)

Red Square

The heart of Moscow and a symbol of Russian history and culture, bordered by the Kremlin, St. Basil's Cathedral and GUM department store.



St. Basil's Cathedral (Vasily Cathedral)

The iconic onion-domed cathedral commissioned by Ivan the Terrible in the 16th century. Its colourful spires have become the most recognisable symbol of Russia.



GUM Mall (Entry Included)

A historic luxury department store facing Red Square, famed for its grand glass-roofed arcades and ornate late-19th-century architecture.



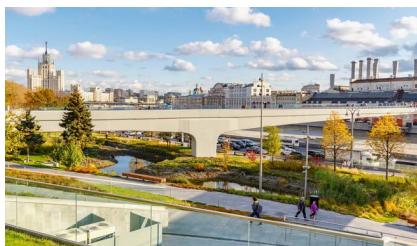
The Kremlin (Entry Included)

The location of the Russian presidential palace and a symbol of the Russian state. A fortified complex housing centuries-old cathedrals, palaces and the seat of Russian power.



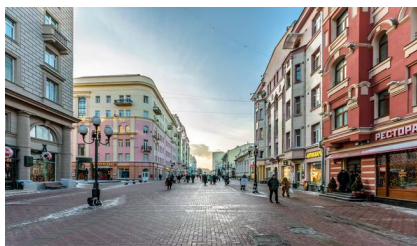
Moscow Metro (Entry Included)

Known as the "underground palace" of Russia, featuring stunning marble halls, mosaics, chandeliers and sculptures across its historic stations.



Zaryadye Park + Skywalk

A striking modern urban park beside the Kremlin opened in 2017, featuring the famous "floating bridge" that extends out over the Moskva River with sweeping views of Red Square.



Arbat Street

One of Moscow's oldest and most beloved pedestrian boulevards, lined with cafés, souvenir shops, street performers, artists and historic buildings.

Day 3 Murmansk (Teriberka)



Teriberka

A remote Arctic coastal village on the shores of the Barents Sea, famous for its hauntingly beautiful "ship graveyard" landscape where abandoned vessels lie scattered along the rugged shore.



Chasing the Aurora

Venture out into the Arctic night in pursuit of the breathtaking Northern Lights -- vivid green ribbons of light dancing across the polar sky.

New Sami Village

A traditional indigenous Sami settlement where visitors can experience reindeer-herding culture, traditional crafts and authentic Arctic life.



Reindeer Sleigh / Dog Sled

Ride Santa's transportation through the snow world for an unforgettable Arctic adventure across frozen landscapes.



Chasing the Aurora

Day 5 Murmansk -> St. Petersburg



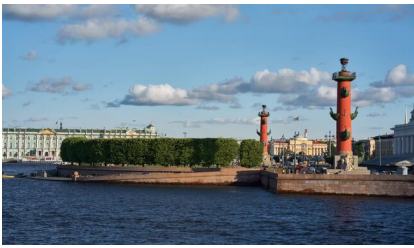
Landmark Monument

Iconic monuments marking the world's largest city north of the Arctic Circle, including the famous "Alyosha" memorial honouring WWII defenders of the Soviet Arctic.



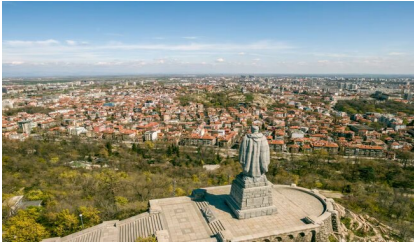
Lenin Nuclear-Powered Icebreaker (Entry Included)

The world's first nuclear-powered surface ship, launched in 1957 and now permanently moored in Murmansk as a museum dedicated to Arctic exploration.



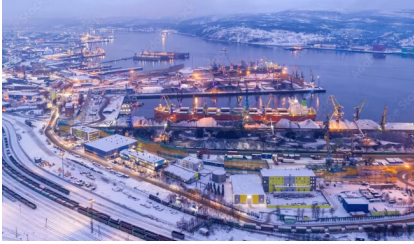
Lighthouse Monument

A memorial complex honouring sailors lost at sea, featuring a tall lighthouse-shaped monument with sweeping views over the Kola Bay.



Semyon Statue & Aleksandr Statue

Commemorative statues honouring local heroes and historical figures of Murmansk.



Murmansk Port

The largest ice-free port in the Arctic, a vital hub for Russia's northern sea route and home to the country's nuclear icebreaker fleet.



Ice Float

Experience being a "crayfish" in the Arctic Ocean -- a unique and unforgettable thrill of floating in icy waters in a specially designed thermal suit.

Day 6 *St. Petersburg*



The State Hermitage Museum (Entry Included) + Palace Square

One of the world's four major museums, founded in 1764 by Catherine the Great. Houses over three million works of art inside the former Winter Palace of the Russian tsars.



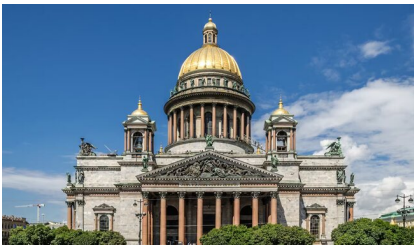
Decembrists' Square (Twelve-Party Square)

A historic square where the Decembrist uprising of 1825 took place, surrounded by grand neoclassical buildings.



Bronze Horseman Statue

An iconic equestrian statue of Peter the Great commissioned by Catherine the Great in 1782, immortalised in Pushkin's poem of the same name.



St. Isaac's Cathedral (Isakiev Church)

One of the largest cathedrals in the world, completed in 1858 and featuring a stunning gilded dome that dominates St. Petersburg's skyline.



Church of the Savior on Spilled Blood (Blood-Dripping Church)

A spectacular Russian-style church built on the spot where Tsar Alexander II was assassinated in 1881, famous for its colourful onion domes and intricate mosaic interiors.



Kazan Cathedral

A magnificent Russian Orthodox cathedral on Nevsky Prospect, designed by Russian architect Voronikhin and modelled after St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.



Nevsky Prospect (Neva Street)

St. Petersburg's main 4.5km-long avenue, lined with historic palaces, churches, theatres and grand boutiques -- the heart of the city's social and cultural life.
