Helsinki Cathedral

Located in the Kruunuhaka neighbourhood in the centre of Helsinki, this neoclassical landmark was built between 1830 and 1852 as a tribute to the Grand Duke of Finland, Tsar Nicholas I of Russia.



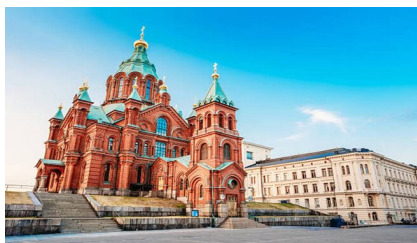
Tempeliaukio Church

A Lutheran church in the Toolo neighbourhood, carved directly into solid rock. Designed by brothers Timo and Tuomo Suomalainen, it opened in 1969 and is renowned for its remarkable acoustics.



Senate Square

A celebrated square showcasing the neoclassical architecture of Carl Ludvig Engel in the centre of Helsinki. The square and its surroundings make up the oldest part of central Helsinki.



Uspenski Cathedral

Claimed to be the largest Orthodox church in Western Europe, this red-brick cathedral was built between 1862 and 1868 and crowns a hillside overlooking the harbour.



Market Square

Helsinki's most famous open-air market beside the South Harbour, where stalls sell Finnish produce, handicrafts and seafood against a backdrop of historic waterfront buildings.



Sibelius Monument

Dedicated to the Finnish composer Jean Sibelius, this striking abstract monument of steel pipes stands in Sibelius Park in the Toolo district of Helsinki.

Finlandia Hall

A congress and event venue on Toolonlahti Bay designed by architect Alvar Aalto. Each year Finlandia Hall hosts many of the world's most acclaimed music performers and ensembles.

Day 4 Stockholm B / L / D



Stockholm City Hall

The seat of the Municipal Council for the City of Stockholm and the venue of the annual Nobel Prize banquet, it is one of the city's most iconic buildings, crowned by a tower over 100 metres high.



Vasa Ship Museum

A maritime museum on the island of Djurgarden displaying the Vasa, the only almost fully intact 17th-century ship ever salvaged, which sank on her maiden voyage in 1628. It is the most visited museum in Scandinavia.



Royal Palace

The official residence and principal royal palace of the Swedish monarch, used for representative purposes by the King while performing his duties as head of state.



Riddarholm Church

The burial church of the Swedish monarchs, today used only for burial and commemorative purposes after being discontinued as a royal burial place in favour of the Royal Cemetery.



Gamla Stan (Old Town)

The old town of Stockholm, one of the largest and best-preserved medieval city centres in Europe, with cobbled lanes and ochre-coloured merchant houses.

Day 5 Stockholm -> Orebro (200KM, 2H20M) -> Hamar (356KM, 4H40M) | Meal: B.



Orebro Castle

A medieval castle fortification set on an island in the river Svartan. The tower was expanded in the 14th century into a larger stronghold, and most of the impressive castle seen today was completed by the end of the 16th.

Lake Vanern

The largest lake in Sweden and in the European Union, and the third-largest entirely in Europe after Ladoga and Onega in Russia.



Lake Mjosa

Norway's largest lake and one of the deepest lakes in both Norway and Europe.

Hamar Old Town

A lakeside town on Mjosa known for its medieval cathedral ruins, now sheltered beneath a vast glass canopy, and its relaxed waterfront setting.

Day 6 Hamar -> Lom (275KM, 3H55M) -> Hellesylt (180KM, 2H45M) -> Geiranger (21KM, ..)

Stave Church

A medieval wooden Christian church of a type once common across north-western Europe, distinguished by its load-bearing timber posts and steeply tiered roofs.



Geirangerfjorden

One of Norway's most celebrated fjords and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, framed by sheer cliffs, abandoned mountain farms and cascading waterfalls.



Seven Sisters Waterfall

A row of seven separate streams plunging side by side down the cliffs of the Geirangerfjord, among the most photographed waterfalls in Norway.

Day 7 Geiranger -> Hellesylt (by Ferry, 1H15M) -> Stryn (51KM, 1H) -> Briksdalbreen.



Briksdalbreen

An arm of the great Jostedalbreen glacier, reached by an open "troll car" jeep ride through a valley of waterfalls to the foot of the blue glacial ice.



Voss

A town rich in cultural and natural heritage set among lakes and mountains, offering plentiful sights whether visited for a few hours or several days.



Fish Market

Bergen's lively waterfront market, a long-standing meeting place where fresh seafood, local produce and crafts are sold beside the harbour.



Bergenhus Castle

One of Norway's oldest and best-preserved fortresses, guarding the entrance to Bergen harbour since the Middle Ages.



Bryggen (Wharf)

The old Hanseatic wharf of Bergen, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and an enduring reminder of the town's role in the Hanseatic League's trading empire.



Haakon's Hall

A medieval stone hall within Bergenhus Fortress, built in the 13th century as a royal residence and ceremonial banqueting hall.



Market Square

The historic central square of Bergen at the head of the harbour, a traditional gathering point in the heart of the old town.



Bergen Cathedral

Dating from the 12th century and rebuilt several times over the centuries, it remains one of Bergen's oldest and most significant churches.

Scenic Train Route

The Bergen Line carries travellers across high mountain plateaus, past fjords, waterfalls and snowfields on one of the world's most scenic railway journeys to Oslo.

Day 10 Oslo -> Copenhagen (Board Overnight Cruise - 2 Berth Inside Cabin, 17H).



Frogner Park & Vigeland Sculpture

Frogner Park contains the world-famous Vigeland installation, a permanent collection of sculptures created by Gustav Vigeland -- the world's largest sculpture park made by a single artist.



Viking Ship Museum

Part of the Museum of Cultural History of the University of Oslo, housing archaeological finds from the Tune, Gokstad, Oseberg and Borre mound sites.



Karl Johans Gate

Oslo's main avenue, running from the central station to the Royal Palace and lined with shops, cafes and landmark buildings.



Holmenkollen

A hillside district above Oslo famous for its monumental ski jump and sweeping panoramic views over the city and fjord.



Royal Palace

The official residence of the Norwegian monarch, set at the end of Karl Johans Gate amid landscaped parkland.

Aker Brygge

A vibrant waterfront district of restaurants, shops and promenades built on a former shipyard along the Oslofjord.



Astrup Fearnley Museum

A museum of modern and contemporary art at Tjuvholmen, housed in a distinctive sail-roofed building designed by Renzo Piano.



City Hall

The seat of Oslo's municipal government and the venue where the Nobel Peace Prize is awarded each year.



Akershus Fortress

A medieval castle built to protect Oslo that has also served as a prison, offering panoramic views over the harbour at Aker Brygge.



Opera House

Home of the Norwegian National Opera and Ballet, its sloping white marble roof rises directly from the fjord and can be walked upon.

Day 11 Copenhagen | Meal: B / L / D



Gefion Fountain

A large fountain depicting the Norse goddess Gefjon driving four oxen, set near the Langelinie promenade.



Little Mermaid

A bronze statue by Edvard Eriksen depicting a mermaid, displayed on a rock by the waterside at the Langelinie promenade in Copenhagen.



The Old Stock Exchange

Built under the ambition of King Christian IV to establish Copenhagen as a centre of finance and trade, famous for its distinctive dragon-tail spire.



Christiansborg Palace

A palace and government building in central Copenhagen housing the Danish Parliament, the Prime Minister's Office and the Supreme Court; several parts of the palace are open to the public.



Amalienborg Palace

The winter home of the Danish royal family, formed by four identical classical facades with rococo interiors around an octagonal courtyard centred on an equestrian statue of King Frederick V.
