Bukit Melawati

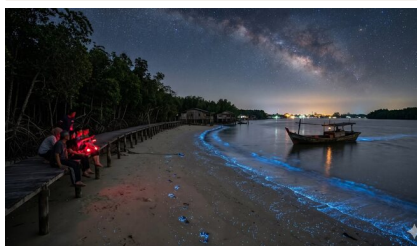
